Assessment Respondents

OVERVIEW

The following table summarizes site-specific details about public waterfront spaces provided by civic organization respondents to the stewardship assessment. Each civic organization that conducted stewardship at a specific site was asked to fill out information about that site, site condition, types of programming conducted at the site, and site challenges. Separation between entries was maintained (i.e. more than one entry for a particular site indicates more than one steward). The responses are directly taken from answers to the assessment questions (see Appendix B for the full set of assessment questions). In particular, the questions informing columns in the table are from *Section 10 of 10: specific site features* and are as follows:
